What is the Georgia Milestones Assessment System?

The Georgia Milestones Assessment System is a comprehensive assessment system spanning grades 3 through high school. Georgia Milestones measures how well students have learned the knowledge and skills outlined in-the state adopted content standards in English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies. Students in grades 3 through 8will take the End of Grade (EOG) measures in each content area, whilechigol students will take End of Course (EOC) measures for each of the ten courses associated with the EOC measures.

I've heard a lot about college and career readiness. How do I know if my student is college and career ready?

Georgia Milestones was developed to send a signal of college and career readiness for Georgia's students. Students achieve the proficient level or higher have demonstrated, in part, that they are ready for their next endeavor upon graduation. Georgiasdefined College and Career Ready as:

Students who are on-track to possess the English language arts/literacy/mathematics knowledge and skills needed upon graduation to enter directly and succeed in

- entry-level credit-bearing postsecondary courses, without the need for remedial coursework; or,
- job training and/or postsecondary education necessary for his/her chosen career (e.g., technical/vocational program, community college, apprenticeship or significant on-the-job training).
